Burglaries Update

Over the last 6 months there has been an increase in burglary in the area. There have been many instances of properties being broken into where the primary intention is to obtain car keys in order to steal cars. In our last Newsletter we mentioned the website **www.streetlife.com** which provides a forum to keep others informed about issues (including crime) in the area. It's free so we urge you to take a look.

The Police and Community Support Officers suggest a few tips to help reduce or limit the impact of burglary:-

- Alarm your property and fit individual vibration alarms to vulnerable doors and windows.
- Lock all internal doors which should slow down any intruder.
- Remove all keys and valuables from sight.
- Prepare your own plan of action should you need it.

The Community Police have told us that they are understaffed and have to give priority to the most serious crimes. We urge all residents to look closely at their own security management and make improvements accordingly.

Useful tip from SARA: Be careful when updating your social media, even casual mentions of your new work schedule, upcoming dinner date, or event you're planning to attend can offer important clues about your routine. Think before you post!

Local History Class Update - Aigburth

The WEA local history class that launched in September has proved to be very popular. A new ten week term will start on Wednesday 1st February at 1.30pm. An interesting excerpt from the course materials on the origins of Aigburth is below.

There are two possible origins of the name 'Aigburth': it could have been where the Viking 'Aiges' berthed his longboat; or it could derive from the old Norse 'eikr' meaning oak tree and the old English 'beorg' or hill, hence 'hill where the oak trees grow'.

Before 1066, Aigburth was just heath and woodland with a gentle slope down to the river. The earliest known settlement after this date was on the higher ground of what is now Aigburth Vale, alongside the Osklesbrook which rose in Wavertree, ran down through Sefton Park, down the Vale and into the Mersey. Later part of this stream was called the River Jordan by Puritans, hence the name of Jericho Lane. The stream still exists underground which is why the basements of buildings in Aigburth Vale are prone to flooding.
